 **The Deuterocanonical Books / Apocrypha**

These are books that St. Jerome included in his Latin Vulgate version of the entire Bible in 450 CE because they were included in the Septuagint, the Greek translation of the Old Testament that was used by some Jewish people at the time. Today, the books marked with  are considered part of the Sacred Scriptures by the Catholic and Orthodox Churches. They were written later than most of the other books in the Old Testament and today Jews do not consider them to be part of the Tanakh (Bible). Most Protestant Bibles do not consider these to be part of the Sacred Scriptures either. They are often times included in Protestant Bibles, especially Bibles used by Lutherans and Anglicans, as an appendix called the Apocrypha.

Many Orthodox Churches also include several additional books like the Books of Esdras and 3 Maccabees.
