How to format your sources on your "References" page at the end of your paper

Book with 1 author:

Lastnameofauthor, Firstnameofauthor. *Name of Book in Italics*.
Citypublished, Statepublished: Name of Publisher,
Yearofpublication.

Example of book with 1 author:

Lee, Harper. *To Kill a Mockingbird*. New York: Warner Books, 1982.

Encyclopedia or book article that lists the author of the article:

Lastnameofauthor, Firstnameofauthor. "Name of Article in Quotations
Marks." *Name of Book in Italics*. Citypublished,
Statepublished: Name of Publisher, Yearofpublication. Pages
of Article.

Example of encyclopedia or book article that lists the author of the article:

Gillingham, John. "Norman Conquest." *The World Book Encyclopedia*.
New York, NY: World Book, 1998. 438-442.

Encyclopedia or book article that does not list the author of the article:

"Name of Article in Quotations Marks." Ed. Editorfirstname
Editorlastname. *Name of Book in Italics*. . Editorfirstname
Editorlastname. Citypublished, Statepublished: Name of
Publisher, Yearofpublication. Pages of Article.
